## **Insurance Coverage:**

In most cases if you are shown to have Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA) after an overnight sleep test, your medical insurance may pay most if not all of the cost for the oral appliance. In order to maximize your benefits, we have enlisted a company that specializes in medical reimbursement for Sleep Apnea Appliances. They take your medical information and will in turn predetermine coverage, write any necessary narratives, handle all correspondences and will set up any necessary home sleep tests along with having them read by a sleep specialist. In short they maximize your benefits while minimizing your involvement with insurance companies.

Now, if you have had a recent sleep test, within the past two years that will be sufficient for insurance and treatment purposes. Also if you were previously diagnosed with OSA and treated with a Continuous Positive Airway Pressure (CPAP) mask yet find it difficult or inconvenient (low compliance) to use and you fit the criteria for oral appliance therapy, you can switch. In most cases, your medical insurance will cover the oral appliance for OSA by simply filing a **CPAP Intolerance form** with your insurance company which we take care of for you.
